Planted Symphony is a free musical experience.



You listen to it from an **app** on your phone or tablet computer as you go through an outdoor trail.



The experience lasts around 20 to 30 minutes.



An **app** is a computer programme for your phone, tablet or computer.



The story of Lagether

Planted Symphony tells the story of Lagether.

She uses herbs to heal people.



In the story she calls on nature to share its secrets.



The story is told through spoken words, songs, flowers and plants.



The music

As you move around the outdoor trail the music shifts from whispers to beats and rhythm.

The music comes from:

cellos

- clarinets
- MiMu gloves

MiMu gloves let you change the sounds and music by moving your hands and arms.

A **marimba** is a bit like a xylophone. It uses wooden blocks to make music.



The outdoor trail

The outdoor trail is safe from COVID-19.



It is wheelchair accessible on hard paths with some very slight ups and downs.



It is less than 400m long. There are places to rest if you want.

We encourage everyone to go at their own pace.



It's outdoors, so wear suitable clothes.



What to bring

Bring your phone, tablet and headphones to enjoy the experience.

We can lend you:

- a mobile phone
- headphones, either in your ear or over your ear
 - headphone splitters these mean that you can have 2 headphones working from 1 phone or tablet
- subpacs these are things you can wear which help you experience the music through vibrations.
 Subpacs are good for people who have difficulty with hearing.
