Introduction

IF: Milton Keynes International Festival welcomes everyone and seeks to improve access at each new Festival edition. We do this through developing new creative work with D/deaf and disabled artists and working with interpreters to make our artworks and performances accessible. The programming and production team consider access for our artists, performers, audiences, participants, volunteers and staff at every stage throughout the 10 days of the Festival and during the two years of the Festival's development. We also work with local partners in Milton Keynes

to improve access facilities and develop connections with D/deaf and disabled communities.

If you are visiting the Festival you will be greeted by our friendly team of staff and volunteers who include D/deaf and Disabled people.

About the Festival

The Festival takes place every 2 years. It last for 10 days and this year starts on Friday 18th July and finishes on Sunday 27th July.

Please note that **Michael Pendry: Les Colombes**, a new Festival art installation in Middleton Hall, centre:mk, begins earlier than the main festival. Michael will begin installing hundreds of white origami doves from the 3 July, some of which will be made by people from Milton Keynes in workshops including in centre:mk.

The Festival's multi-art form programme is packed with free family events, new commissions and premieres, community

projects large-scale outdoor and family events including dance, theatre, concerts, talks and visual art installations.

The Festival takes place in Central Milton Keynes, including centre:mk shopping centre and across Milton Keynes, in parks, indoor and outdoor public space.

Festival Central in Campbell Park is the heart of the festival, where you can see shows, buy food and drink and soak up the festival atmosphere. The Stables Speigeltent and The Stables Sessions: Acoustic Stage at Festival Central host a programme of music and comedy and there are a wide range of shows which are family friendly in different areas of the park.
